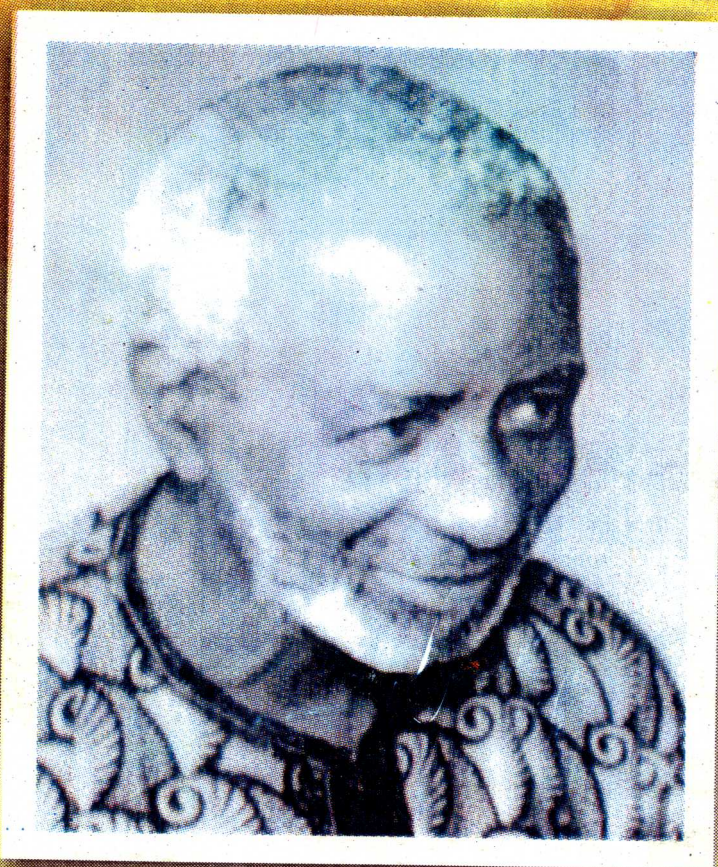

Some of the senior colleagues in this society have retired from their initial universities and are now in other universities. Many more will retire over the next 5 years. Whether the retirees still continue with one university or another, one

thing is clear, the headship of departments of mathematics is now in the hands of younger colleagues in NMS. It is important to highlight the fact that a large number of the senior colleagues received the Ph.D degrees in Europe or USA. On the other hands, most in the latter group received Ph.Ds in Nigeria. Despite the difference in the places of awards, I am convinced the latter group is as competent as the former group. Two things are needed for much success and these are hard work and commitment to cutting edge research and teaching.

There is a dialogue that is on going about how to reform education in Nigeria. There was a time when we had 6-5-2-3 and now we have 6-6-4 and in future ?-?-?-?. What we seem not to realiaise in all the changes is what Professor Paul Halmos taught through many papers and speeches- Education is only as good as the teachers (re-phrasing his original papers). In other words, what is required may not be the mere restructuring of the years or the type of qualifying examinations but much improvement in the quality of the teachers and lecturers at all levels.

In other words, the future of mathematics in Nigeria will depend to a very large extent on the current activities of members of NMS. We must continue to show much interest in mathematics. We must continue to discharge our duties effectively and be committed to high standards.

The world is in economic mess because some people in positions of authority did not possess a strong sense of fairness, good judgement and a high sense of personal integrity. We should therefore inculcate the qualities of fairness, good judgement and integrity in our students through teaching and research.

I wish to remind you, as I conclude this note that we need your comments and suggestions for the 3rd Notices of the Nigerian Mathematical Society.

(a) News from AMS

At the August 1985 meeting the council of the AMS approved a motion to regularly assemble and report the Notices information on the relative numbers of men versus women in at least following categories: membership in AMS, invited hour addresses at AMS meetings, speakers at special session at AMS meetings, percentage of women speakers in AMS special Sessions by gender of organizers, and members of the editorial boards of AMS journals.

It was subsequently decided that this information would be gathered by determining the sex of the individuals in the above categories based on name identification if no other means was available and that additional information on the number of Ph.D.'s granted to women would also be collected using the AMS-ASA-IMS-MAA-SIAM Annual Survey. Since name identification was used, the information for some categories necessitated the use of three classifications:

Male: names that were obviously male

Female: names that were obviously male

Unknown: names that could not be identified as clearly male or

female (e.g., only initials given, non-gender-specific names, etc.)

The following is the twenty-second report of this information. Updated reports will appear annually in the Notices.

INTERNATIONAL MATHEMATICAL UNION

This is a report about the use and misuse of citation data in the assessment of scientific research. The idea that research assessment must be done using “simple and objective” method is increasingly prevalent today. The “simple and objective methods” are broadly interpreted as bibliometrics, that is, citation data and statistics derived from them. There is a belief that citation statistics are inherently more accurate because they substitute simple numbers for complex judgments, and hence overcome the possible subjectivity of peer review.

But this belief is unfounded.

- * Relying on statistics is not more accurate when the statistics are improperly used. Indeed Statistics can mislead when they are misapplied or misunderstood. Much of modern bibliometrics seems to rely on experience and intuition about the interpretation and validity of citation statistics.
- * While numbers appears to be “objective”, their objectivity can be illusory. The meaning of a citation can be even more subjective than peer review. Because this subjectivity is less obvious for citations, those who use citation data are less likely to understand their limitations.
- * The sole reliance on citation data provides at best an incomplete and often shallow understanding of research- an understanding that is valid only when reinforced by other judgments. Numbers are not inherently superior to sound judgments

Using citation data to assess research ultimately means using citation-based statistics, to rank things-journals, papers, people, programs, and discipline. The statistical tools used to rank these things are often

misunderstood and misused.

- * For journals, the impact factor is most often used for ranking. This is a simple average derived from the distribution of citations for a collection of articles in the journal. The average captures only a small amount of information about that distribution, and it is a rather crude statistic. In addition there are many confounding factors when judging journals by citations, and any comparison of journals requires caution when using impact factors. Using the impact factor alone to judge a journal like using weight alone to judge a person's health.
- * For papers, instead of relying on the actual count of citations to compare individual papers, people frequently substitute the impact factor of the journals in which the paper appear. They believe that the higher impact factors must mean higher citation counts. But this is often not the case! This is a pervasive misuse of statistics that needs to be challenged whenever and wherever it occurs.
- * For individual scientists, complete citation records can be difficult to compare. As a consequence, there have been attempts to find simple statistics that capture the full complexity of a scientist's citation record with a single number. The most notable of these is the h-index, which seems to be gaining in popularity. But even a casual inspection of the h-index and its variants shows that these are naïve attempt to understand complicated citation records. While they capture a small amount of information about the distribution of a scientist's citations, they lose crucial information that is essential for the assessment of research.

The validity of statistics such as impact factor and h-index is neither well understood nor well studied. The connection of these statistics with research quality is sometimes established on the basis of "experience". The justification for relying on them is that they are "readily available". The few studies of these statistics that were done focused narrowly on showing a correlation with some other measure of quality rather than on determining how one can best derive useful information from citation data.

We do not discuss citation statistics as a tool for assessing the quality of research-citation data and statistics can provide some valuable information. We recognize that assessment must be practical and for these reason easily derived citation statistics almost surely will be part of the process. But citation data provide only a limited and incomplete view of research quality, and the statistics derived from citation of data are sometimes poorly understood and misused. Research is too important to measure its value with only a single coarse tool. We hope those involve in assessment will read both the commentary and the details of this report in order to understand not only the limitations of citation statistics but also how better to use them. If we set high standards for the conduct of science, surely we should set equally high standards for assessing its quality.

(a) *Extracts (IMU Reports on citation Statistics)*

The said report analyses important factors and similar statistics based citations. The International Mathematical Union (IMU) released the vital

document (citation Statistics) by the circular index "IMU AO Circular Letter 5/2008" and communicated to NMS through the President Prof. R.O Ayeni in June 2008. The report was facilitated by the joint committee of IMS (Institute of Mathematical Statistics), IMU (International mathematical Union) and ICIAM (International Council for Industrial and Applied Mathematics). The executive committees of IMU, IMS and ICIAM (the three organisations which represent the world community of Pure, Applied and Industrial mathematics and statistics) appointed the trio of John Ewing (Providence, USA: Chair IMU), Robert Alder (Haifa, Israel- IMS) and Peter Taylor (Melbourne, Australia-ICIAM) to form the committee on 'Quantitative Assessment of Research' and this was announced through IMU-Net 24, July 2007. IMU in the letter to NMS partly writes about effort as having been "...triggered by numerous request from IMU member countries, mathematical societies, important mathematical institutions and individuals who reported the increasing use (and misuse) of impact factor and similar of other citation based indicators to measure the quality of research of individuals, departments or whole institutions".

It is expected that the careful analysis and recommendations in the report in question will be considered by decision-makers who make use of citation data in research assessments.

(b) IMU Exchange Programme

Mathematical Societies that are adhering members of IMU could seek assistance of IMU with respect of change of Professors.

It was not all work for Dr. Nakamaye as he was taken on a tour within and outside the University to savor the beautiful and nature endowed environment.

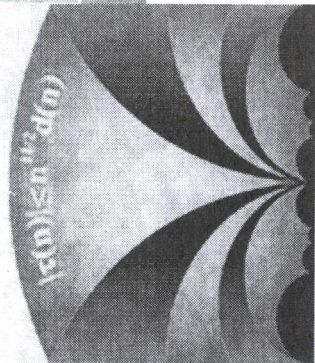
